<p>Course Aims:</p> <p>Beginning with ancient heritage, the course will present the main political, cultural and socio-economical processes which determined the Serbian history from the Early Middle Ages till the end of the 20th century.</p>		
<p>Learning Outcomes:</p> <p>After completion of the course, it is expected that students gain basic knowledge about the main epochs of Serbian history as well as the ability to determine the main social, political and cultural processes that characterized the historical development of the Serbs. Students will also become familiar with the most important fact about Serbian culture in the broader historical and European context. Hence, the scholarly insight gained during this course, graduate teachers and preschool teachers will be able to widely implement in their teaching activities.</p>		
<p>Syllabus:</p> <p><i>Theory</i></p> <p>I Early Middle Ages: Slavic settlement in the Balkans, establishing of the first principalities, Christianization; II High Middle Ages: Nemanjić dynasty, independent Serbian kingdom and Autocephalous Archbishopric, Stefan Dušan - "king and emperor", medieval Serbian culture; III: Late Middle Ages: disintegration of Serbian Empire and the Ottoman conquest; IV Early Modern History: Social development of the Serbs in the Ottoman Empire; migrations; political, social and cultural development of Serbs in the Habsburg monarchy; V "The long 19th century": Serbian revolution (1804-1830), principality/kingdom of Serbia (1830-1914), Serbs in the Habsburg monarchy, Serbs in Montenegro; VI "The short 20th century": Balkan Wars and First World War, Kingdom of Yugoslavia (1918-1941), Second World War, socialist modernization in the "second Yugoslavia", Serbs and the disintegration of Yugoslavia.</p> <p><i>Practice</i></p> <p>Modern Serbian history in literature and movies – analyzing of the most characteristic and most important works.</p>
