<p>Course Aims: During the teaching practice student should implement the gained knowledge in the classroom and to get to know the institution of school, how it functions, how paper work should be done, etc..</p>
<p>Learning Outcomes:</p> <p>To get a more realistic image of how schools work, how to communicate with children, and how to compile the Observational Journal. Students ready to work professionally and independently.</p>
<p>Syllabus:</p> <p>During the one-week practice, students are writing an Observational Journal about the lessons, impressions, experiences. The Journal should include: the name and address of the school, the brief history of the institution and general information about the institution, name of the teacher, the class and the department, brief description of the teaching hours, which professional literature was found in the school, etc. .</p> <p>The student is getting to know all parts of the school (library, student organization, daycare), how to work with children with special needs, introducing different forms of cooperation with parents and the social environment, how to resolve conflicts. The student should get to know the pedagogical documentation, the annual operational plan of the school, the calendar for the current school year and the school yearbook.</p> <p>After conducting the pedagogical practice, the Observational Journal with a certificate on successful practice is submitted to the person in charge at the University.</p>
