<b>Course Aims:</b> Introduction into contemporary linguistics, especially Hungarian generative grammar, generative philology, morphology and syntax of Hungarian language.
<b>Learning Outcomes:</b>  Acquiring scientific and professional terminology, students will be able to actively use their knowledge in contemporary linguistics. They will be able to interpret referential grammars of Hungarian language and use actively new school grammars for lower grades of elementary schools.
<b>Syllabus:</b> <i>Theory</i> Syntax. Basic concepts. Basic elements of sentences. Subject and verb. Inner structure of predicative. Noun phrases. Adjective phrases, adverb phrases, prefix phrases, participle phrases, dependent clauses, interpreting pronouns. Morphology. Basic concepts. Conjugation, derivation, compounds. Phonology, basic concepts. Vowels, consonants. Syllables. Prosody. <i>Practice</i> Presentation and use of morphological, syntactic and phonological analysis, application of principles, laws and rules of generative grammar. Interpreting results and using them in further work.
