Course Aims: Completing B1 level and improve general language competence within two language skills (listening and speaking). Developing communication skills necessary to successfully communicate in various situations.
Learning Outcomes: B1 in German, deepened and enhanced general language competencies. Students have developed the communication skills necessary for successfully communicating in various life situations.
Syllabus: <i>Theory</i> Two language skills are developed during the course (understanding and listening, and speaking), but special emphasis is placed on developing communication skills. The course is focused on communication in everyday life. Students enrich their vocabulary with words from everyday life and use them actively, while practicing pronunciation. <i>Practice</i> Practical sessions follow the theoretical input.
