Course Aims: Introduction to the basic concepts of ethnology, understanding the meaning of basics and key ethnological concepts through the historical perspective. Introduction to the scientific methodology of ethnology, through the characteristics and phenomena of Vojvodina.		
Learning Outcomes: <p>After successfully completing the course, students will be introduced to the basic scientific concepts of ethnology, the categories of this science, as well as to the basics of theoretical and research methods of ethnology. The course will also introduce the folk culture of Vojvodina, its place and role within European culture, as well as the possibility of applying this knowledge in educational work.</p>		
Syllabus: <i>Theory</i> <p>Scientific approach to ethnology (ethnography, folklore, ethnology and anthropology). Ethnological sciences (tradition, community, folk culture, popular culture, , subculture, etc.). Basics of ethnology (tradition, community, folk culture, popular culture, great traditions, small traditions, elite culture, official culture, culture of various groups). History of ethnology. Methodology of research (problems and methods of field work, collecting, recording, archiving and analyzing materials). Characteristics of the urban development of Vojvodina, as well as its ethnic map and the peculiarities of folk cultures.</p> <i>Practice</i> <p>The practical sessions are following the theoretical inputs.</p>
