Syllabus:

Theory

The concept, subject and tasks of Fine Arts. Methodology of research and the initial development of fine arts. Differentiated work. Methodological principles. Teaching facilities, equipment and teaching tools. Interdisciplinary and integral approach. Modern ways of planning. Innovative models of work. Modern tendencies in evaluation and self-evaluation. Modern ways of checking and recording. Methodology of research.

Practice

Participation of students in children's art activities. Orientation of children's artistic creativity. Equipment and preparations for events in preschool institutions. Orientational work plan for yearly, half-yearly, quarterly periods. Art workshops. Students will be able to practice with classical and innovative techniques and materials and to shape and to use recycled materials. This way, students will encourage the development of the artistic expression of children and their creativity.
