<b>Goal of the subject</b> Consideration of the changes that occurred at the end of the 20 <sup>th</sup> and during the 21 <sup>st</sup> century in the countries of this region and comparisons with the rest of Europe.		
<b>Outcome of the subject</b> Students should acquire complex knowledge about the region of the Southeast Europe, realize significant differences in the regional development of its individual parts and learn a critical approach to regional-geographical perceptions of processes and phenomena.		
<b>Content of the subject</b> <i>Theoretical lectures</i> Spatial determination and borders of the Southeast Europe; Physical-geographical characteristics, Socio-geographical characteristics with an emphasis on the historical-geographical development of the Southeast Europe; Regional-geographical development and regional structure by countries (special attention is paid to socio-geographical changes); Comparison of regional-geographical developments within the region, as well as with other regions in Europe; The Southeast European countries (Romania, Bulgaria, Greece, Albania, Serbia, Montenegro, Northern Macedonia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia) within the European integration processes, Euro-regions and cross-border cooperation.
