Preparing a heeling-in place for nursery stock. Nursery stock preparation for extracting. Extracting nursery stock, sorting, tying bundles and tagging. Nursery stock transportation, nursery stock protection against rodents. Storage in soil according to fruit species and cultivars. Winter spraying of nursery stock in storage in soil according to fruit species. Spraying peach nursery stock. Grapevine winter pruning, Grapevine summer pruning, Vineyard planting, Grapevine training system formation, Vineyard support system installing, Grape harvesting, Rootstock cuttings preparing for grafting, Grapevine cuttings preparing for grafting, Grafting techniques.
