<b>Course Aims:</b> Introducing students to the basic procedures and operations performed in organic agriculture, ie plant and / or livestock production.			
<b>Learning Outcomes:</b> Acquiring knowledge of basic procedures and operations performed in organic plant and / or livestock production, possible work effects per unit of time or product, norms of individual technological operations.			
<b>Syllabus:</b> Selection of production property by students. Introduction to all operations that are applied in production conditions on the selected production farm. Depending on the type of production, students would gain insight into the processes of plant or livestock organic production that take place in the summer or early autumn. After the internship, students are required to submit to the head of the internship Diary of production internship (in the form of a form that will be distributed) and to defend their work through a presentation, with reference to the basic activities of the farm, applied operations changes.
