Course Aims: The aim of the course is to address specific designers' tasks in horticulture, especially the problem of landscaping the smaller spatial units.

Syllabus:			
<i>Theory</i> The concept of categories of green spaces. The structure of green spaces. Horticultural landscaping. Elements of composition. Defining the content and design elements.			
<i>Practice</i> Development of conceptual designs of smaller public urban units and smaller private gardens, through the application of general design principles of this type of space with special emphasis on the planting material used (selection, replacement, quality) with respect to local environmental condition and spirit of the place (<i>genius loci</i>).
