<p>Course Aims:</p> <p>Education and training of a student for direct work in hunting and hunting tourism.</p> <p>Upon completion of the study, the student is trained in the development and implementation of his knowledge of hunting and hunting tourism.</p>
<p>Learning Outcomes:</p> <p>Form of experts with academic education possessing significantly expanded and deepened knowledge for the necessary understanding of the scientific basis of hunting and hunting economy and hence hunting tourism as a specific type of tourism. The acquired knowledge of a student of completed basic academic studies provides expertise in hunting and hunting tourism</p>
<p>Syllabus:</p> <p><i>Theory</i></p> <p>Fundamentals of hunting tourism: concept, origin, characteristics. Hunting tourism as an economic activity: hunting-tourism resources, hunting-tourist demand and supply. Biology of mammal game: deer, wild boar, rabbit, bear, wolf, jackal, fox, lynx, wild cat, martens, badgers, otters. Biology of birds: pheasant, field partridge, quail partridge, quails, big grouse, small grouse, florist, wild ducks, wild geese, eagles, hawks, owls, crows, pigeons, doves. System of game diversification. Planning and organization of hunting management: establishment of hunting grounds, annual management plan. Hunting concept, hunting grounds classing. Ways (techniques) of hunting. Tourist hunting. Slaughtered game procedure. Game capture and transportation. Hunting legislation, regulations and hunting ethics. Hunting weapons, ammunition and ballistics. Kinology: Dog breeds. Trophies of the game: preparation and processing of the trophy, evaluation of the trophy. Hunting exhibitions and events.</p> <p><i>Practice</i></p> <p>Other forms of teaching. Study research work: Biology of game: recognition of wild game on preparations. Planning and organization of management. Elements of the creation of a hunting basis and an annual plan. Hunting techniques. Organization and technique for determining game counts. Field visit with the goal of getting acquainted with the game, hunting grounds, breeding grounds, game farms, hunting and technical facilities. Types of weapons and ammunition. Kinology: recognition of dog breeds. Game trophies: Practical Evaluation trophies.</p>
