Creative research - terminology, types of research, structure of research. Development of creative research in architecture and urban planning, during the 20th century. Analysis, synthesis, classification and comparative arrangement of existing architectural and urban practices and their projects, based on creative research. Possibilities of applying creative research in architecture and urban planning. Possibilities of applying creative architectural and urban research results in other disciplines.</p>
