The result of the work within the subject will include the development of a constructive and critical determination according to the complex reality in modern cities based on the connection between abstract and practical knowledge.			
<b>Syllabus.</b> The relationship between formal and informal spheres of urban life - spatial, social, economic, cultural and political aspects of dichotomous and dualist models; Conceptual definitions and historical perspective; "Informalities" in modern cities: beyond formal plans and regulations; Alternative approaches to urban development; Forms of "informalities" in modern cities - temporary uses of space, ephemeral structures, artistic practices, forms of "self-organization", self-building of houses, illegal inhabiting...; The settings of a design and planning approach based on the socio-spatial continuum and the interaction between the formal and the informal.
