<b>Course Aims:</b> Appropriation of theoretical knowledge in the field of phonetics and phonology as well as the acquisition of the specifics of the German phonetic and phonological system in order to develop the ability for auditory identification of vocal sounds and their correct articulation. The mastery of the spelling of the German language, practice and mastery of the pronunciation of German sounds, recognition and correction of pronunciation and spelling errors.		
<b>Learning Outcomes:</b> Students have basic knowledge of phonetics and phonology, as well as spelling the German language.		
<b>Syllabus:</b> <u>Theory:</u> The course is an introduction to phonetics and phonology as linguistic disciplines. As part of the exercises, the following thematic units will be edited: -in the field of phonetics: Definition and classification of phonetics, perception and production of sounds, sounds and their combination, physiological basis of speech, applied phonetics; -in the field of phonology: Definition and classification of phonology, phon, phoneme, allophone and distinctive features, phonological system of the German language. <u>Practice:</u> The German alphabet, German graphics, different debates of individual graphemes, the accent (stressed and unstressed syllables), open and closed vowels as well as the German spelling are also processed.
