<p><i>Theory: Conceptual and terminological definition of discourse and text. Discourse analysis according to related linguistic disciplines. Interdisciplinarity in the analysis of linguistic data. Review of modern theoretical approaches and methods: theory of speech acts, theory of implicatures, cognitive theory, speech genre theory, conversational analysis, critical discourse analysis. Basic features of discourse. Language and speech. Language and pragmatics. Discourse strategies: opening, closing, speaking order. Different contexts of interaction: discourse and society, discourse and culture, discourse and gender, discourse and identity, discourse and ideology. Types of communication: verbal and nonverbal. Gestures and facial expressions. Planned and unplanned speech.
