Syllabus:

Theory: Morphology as a part of language system. Word as a grammar and semantic unit. Types of morphemes in contemporary Russian. Derivation. Nouns. Grammatical categories and classifications. Declensions. Variants in the case forms: history and semantics. Prepositions. Pronouns. Grammatical categories and classification. Declensions. Adjectives. Grammatical categories and classifications. Declensions. Comparison of adjectives. Numerals. Grammatical categories and classification. Declensions.

Practice: Analysis of texts. Application of theoretical knowledge on language material.
