Course Aims: The purpose of this course is for students to get familiarised with the most important events in the history of the city of Novi Sad and also with the methodology of the contemporary Urban history studies.			
Learning Outcomes: Students should gain basic knowledge of the history of Novi Sad as an urban settlement - from the Prehistoric times to the nowadays, and learn about its famous scientists, writers, sports persons, politicians etc.			
Syllabus: <i>Theory</i> Prehistoric settlements in the wider Novi Sad area; medieval fortress of Petrovaradin; the foundation of Novi Sad (Neoplanta) in the late 17 th century; acquiring of the status of Free Royal Town in the 1748; the devastation of Novi Sad in the 1848/49 Revolution; becoming the center of Serbian culture (“Serbian Athens”) in the late 19 th century; the administrative, demographic and economic rise of Novi Sad in the period between two world wars; war crimes during the Second world war; the capital city of the Autonomous Province of Vojvodina <i>Practice</i> Visits to cultural institutions (museums, archives, libraries etc)
