Developing critical thinking and a multi-perspective approach in independently interpreting the results of scientific research from political, social, legal, economic, and cultural aspects.</p>
<p><b>Learning Outcomes:</b></p> <p>The ability to independently describe and interpret the most important historical phenomena, events, and processes based on the results of modern scientific research and critical analysis of historical sources and literature.</p>
<p><b>Syllabus:</b></p> <p><i>Theory</i></p> <p>Acquaintance with the approach to studying the history of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, the European crisis and the First World War, learning the course of the war, the most important battles and political changes at the end of the war, peace treaties and their implementation, history of major world states (Italy under the fascists, France, Great Britain, the USA, the revolution in Russia and the USSR, the Balkans between the two world wars) in the interwar period, the driving forces of international politics between the two world wars, the political crisis of the 1930s and the road to a new war, the political ideologies of the 20th century, the theory and history of fascism, the history of communism in the 20th century, the Holocaust, The Great Depression, state interventionism and the beginning of Keynesian economics.</p> <p><i>Practice</i></p> <p>Reading of historical sources and literature and critical reflection on them, presentation of students' homework.</p>
