<b>Learning Outcomes:</b> Training students for independent creation of an opera character through the process of creating an opera work			
<b>Syllabus:</b> Opera Studio is a course which comprises students' knowledge and skills obtained from other courses in music, acting and stage dance. Students are prepared for independent creation of an opera character as well as its music and theatre interpretation. Semester I – music, individual and group preparation of the work with a teacher-conductor and a piano accompanist. Semester II – stage shaping of an opera with a teacher-director In case it is impossible to form an opera ensemble due to the inadequate voice composition, students will individually rehearse their opera roles throughout the year with the supervising teacher.
