<b>Course Aims:</b> Coaching students to perfect the piano as a harmonic instrument.			
<b>Learning Outcomes:</b> Students will have improved their piano playing technique and will better understand the piano as an instrument.			
<p><b>Syllabus:</b></p> <p>The programme is tailored to the student's individual needs and prior experience, focusing on the relation of their musical and technical development. Simultaneously with learning the annual programme, students perform the pieces they have already learned and played. By doing so, students revise the performing techniques, becoming more natural while the motoric and technical requirements are united with music.</p> <p>Students should possess positive attitude to learning and practicing, inner motivation for improvement and development.</p> <p>Practicing technical and musical requirements: scales (major and minor with up to 4 sharps); etudes, polyphony (Bach: French suites, English suites, the Well-Tempered Clavier, preludes, Handel - suites); differentiation of melody and accompaniment in homophony (slow movement of sonatas of Haydn, Mozart, Beethoven, etc.). Students are urged to sight-read with precision, pay attention to articulation, metrics, clear musical form.</p>			
<b>Required Reading:</b> Studies, Bach and Baroque composers, Haydn sonatas, selection of works (all eras)
