Course Aims:

Acquiring a habit of working independently. Developing the capacity to argument one's presentation of the idea related to music conception. Development of the student's intellectual, emotional and creative potentials. Harmonizing different artistic personalities in an ensemble. Mastering the skills needed for chamber music playing. Analysis of all parts within the ensemble so the music forms and dramaturgy of the piece are achieved.

Learning Outcomes: Students are enabled to, within the ensemble, interpret and solve problems in the score. They have mastered the skills, knowledge and experience gained during the classes.

Syllabus:

Forming classical and non-classical ensembles. Introduction to chamber music literature of all epochs. Working on the musical content of the required repertoire and solving technical and interpretative problems.

Understanding the musical content, form and style of a composition; mastering expressive means and technical skills. Acquiring habits of working independently, mastering basic skills of chamber music playing (tempo and rhythm precision, dynamic relations and the balance of the ensemble parts).

Required Reading: Compositions for chamber ensembles (classical and non-classical) of all musical epochs.
