Course Aims: Students are trained to employ the polyphonic way of musical thinking based on traditional forms of various epochs and styles, which is gained by students' working independently on compositions in the given style, as well as by analyzing examples from music literature.

Learning Outcomes: Students understand the rules of the polyphonic language and the specific features of modern contrapuntal technology. Through the introduction to novel phenomena in polyphonic structures students acquire the ability to apply the knowledge in practice, both in analyzing contemporary literature and in their creative approach to composing artworks.

Syllabus:

Fugue (exposition, development section, closing section); fugue (in two, three, four, five voices); fugue (double, triple, quadruple); other instrumental forms of polyphony; vocal-instrumental forms of polyphony.
