Theoretical foundation and development of prehistory and early history of photographic medium.			
Period from prehistory of Photography up to the second half of the 19 th century (development of optics, chemistry, camera obscura principle and introduction of important authors; development of photographic genres).			
<i>Practice</i>			
Students are presented with topics related to contemporary artistic practice (topics, content, and authors) and are directed towards individual thinking and applying the acquired knowledge to their own photographic artistic work. Consultation before the exam.
