Course Aims:

Versatile and harmonious development of a student's personality, his/her intellectual and creative potential, development of talent, careful attitude towards his/her individuality.

Learning Outcomes:

Adjusting high-pitch voice setting with deep breath support. Building a music personality.

Syllabus:

The professor devises a programme for a student's work, taking into account the music background and technical abilities of a student upon entering the studies. An individual approach to working with each student gives the opportunity to create a work programme that is tailored to each individual capability, to complete any potential failures in previous education, and to provide the student with new and basic information about working on music pieces. The work process includes understanding the content and form of compositions, analysis of the music language of composers from different epochs, variety and expressiveness of sound, natural and non-artificial phrasing, intonation, clear articulation and mastery of tone. The development of the student's emotional sphere and intelligence, his/her creative imagination and artistic freedom. Enabling the student for self guidance toward his/her artistic goals and finding the means to realize them.

Program Requirements:

- 1. Compositions of the old masters or cantatas from 17th and 18th century
- 2. Solo songs by 19th century authors
- 3. Solo songs by 20th century authors
- 1. Solo songs by Yugoslav contemporary authors
- 2. Arias from oratorio works
- 3. Concert or opera arias of Classical period or early Romanticism
- 4. Opera arias

Pre-exam requirements:

- 1. Old master compositions or oratorio
- 2. A song by 19th or 20th century authors
- 3. An opera aria or cantata of classical period or early romanticism

Exam Requirements:

- 1. One old Masters composition or aria
- 2. One aria from an oratorio or cantata
- 3. Two songs by 19th century authors
- 4. Two songs by the author of the 20th century
- 5. Two songs by Yugoslav authors
- 6. Two opera arias from different period

(program performed at pre-exam cannot be performed at the exam)

Classes are realized on individual basis: 1 hour of lectures held by the lecturer, 1 class of exercises held by the associate and 1 hour of exercises with the piano accompanist. The piano accompanist also attends the classes.
