**Course Aims:** Creating a story within documentary projects, mastering visualization and composition within photographic frame through exercises in the visual language of photography

**Learning Outcomes:** By doing various exercises students will acquire the basics of visualization, the capacity to find and create stories, as well as the fundamentals of photographic technologies.

Syllabus:

Theory

Theoretical and practical introduction to techniques of analogue black-and-white photography used for realistation of all the assignments in the first year, reportage photography, documentary portrait, Homo faber. An overview of relevant authors in the history of photography focusing on the characteristics of their visual language by analysis of the aesthetic elements and compositional principles.

Practice

Introduction to photographic equipment and working in the laboratory: chemical processes, developing films, contact sheets and final prints. Students are presented with topics related to contemporary documentary practice (topics, content, and authors) and are directed towards individual thinking and applying the acquired knowledge to their own photographic artistic work.
